Judges will place all threshed grain in groups of A, B, and C, according to type, quality and condition Dry land varieties will not compete with irrigated varieties

All samples will consist of one (1) quart of grain, or one (1) quart of legumes. Exhibits will be judged upon uniformity as to size and color of kernels, freedom from dirt, other grains, weed seeds and broken kernels, absence of chaff and straw. All exhibits must have been grown in Juab County in 2024

CLASS 2-SHEAF AND FORAGES

Sheaves must be two inches in diameter and tied just below the head, in center, and on bottom end snugly and in neat bundles. Sheaf grain will be judged on the basis of variety, neatness and appearance of shea. The judge reserves the right to refuse to consider immature, poorly prepared materials

All vegetables should be carefully handled, and be as firm, mature and fresh as possible, cleaned, arranged and exhibited in an attractive way. No decorations such as fancy baskets, grass, ribbons, etc. Root crops should be free from soil, and the fibrous roots removed. Cabbage, Cauliflower and similar types of vegetables should be neatly trimmed. List item variety on Entry Card. In judging the vegetable exhibits, the market requirements and standards for each vegetable will be emphasized.

Fruits should be clean and free from spray residue; they may be polished. Plums and prunes should be handled as little as possible to preserve the natural bloomhey and should not be polished. Grapes may be trimmed and defective berries removed. Stem should be kept intact with all fruit. Any evidence of insect, disease or other injury will be scored severely. Each specimen should be mature, not over mature, perhaps a little on the green side of fully ripe. No decorations allowed

FOOD PRESERVATION RULES

No freezer jams accepted. All jams/jellies, fresh fruit, pickled products, salsa and tomato products must be processed using the boiling water bath method. All meat and vegetable products must be processed using the pressure canner method. All products must be processed according to Utah altitude adjustment for USDA processing times. All products must be canned in standard canning jars - 1/2 pint, 1 pint, or 1 quart jars. All vacuum seals must be intact. **LABEL EACH JAR ON THE BOTTOM WITH THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:** a) Name of exhibitor, b) Name of recipe/ source of recipe, ie USDA, Kerr, Ball, or Pectin brand named) Date canned, d) Processing method and time - water bath, pressure canner, using correct altitude adjustments for your area. Products exhibited must have been prepared since August of 2023 in the home by the person entering them. State Recommendations for County Fair Canning Guidelines. Many of the following requirements are based on **SAFETY** guidelines. ONLY those regarding presentation of exhibit or specific fair preferences are adaptable

SPECIAL RULES FOR HOME CANNING

Canning rules are based on safe food preservation guidelines from approved sources (National Center for Home Food Preservation (NCHFP), USU Extension and Pacific Northwest Extension, USDA, and Ball Canning)
See http://nchfp uga edu, canning usu edu, or www freshpreserving com,

- 1 Only products of home kitchens are eligible,
- 2 Products entered must have been prepared (by the person entering them) since the last state / county fair Older products will not be accepted,
- 3 REQUIRED: All jars must be labeled with name of product, method (water bath or pressure), pack(hot or raw), length of processing time, pounds of pressure (if applicable), altitude, date, city, recipe source (see above) and when the dial gauge was last tested (Year) attached to the bottom of jar if sweeteners other than sugar are used, include on label. Labels are available in advance from USU Extension Office, on their website (http://extension usu edu/juab/files/uploads/fcs/quidelines_with_labels-page pdf) or at time of entry
- 4 All entries must be in clean, standard canning jars (no mayo jars) with new label, single-use two-piece lids and rings,
- 5 A one-quart or pint jar constitutes an exhibit for fruit, vegetables or meat
- 6 One standard-size canning jar constitutes an exhibit for preserves, conserves, pickles, and relishes based on recommendations from an approved recipe
- 7 One pint or 1/2 pint jar with lid constitutes an exhibit for jellies and jams
- 8 Exhibits should be canned using research-tested recipes, i e , USDA, Ball, pectin brand name or NCHFP guidelines issued 2009 or later. Processing adjustments for altitude, time or pressure must be made and explained on entry label
- 9 All fresh fruits, jams, jellies, pickles and relishes must be processed in a boiling water bath and properly sealed. Entries processed in a steam canner will not be accepted,
- 10 No frozen jams or wax seals will be accepted. The presence of mold disqualifies a product
- 11 All meats and vegetables must be processed in a pressure canner
- 12 The exhibitor is requested to loosen the ring on the jar (so judges can remove ring and examine the head space)



GENERAL RULES

- 1. All sheep must be trimmed and in show condition.
- 2. All major trimming and grooming should be done prior to entering.
- 3. All washing must be done at the designated washing areas.
- 4. Exhibitors will keep the pens clean through the fair and cleaned out by the Saturday Aug 12th or premium money will be forfeited and a \$100 fee will be assessed.
- 5. No straw will be allowed in the barn.
- 6. Placement of trimming stands will be under the direction of the sheep supervisor.
- 7. Pee Wee Showmanship is a class for non 4-H members, 8 and younger.
- 8. Judges decision is final.
- All animals will remain at the fair until the release time on Saturday unless approved by the department supervisor. Exhibitors must care for the animals until the Saturday release time or will forfeit premium money.
- 10. All waste/manure must be piled outside the barn in designated area.
- 11. Any exhibitor showing abusive behavior towards their animal will result in disqualification and wil be asked to leave the show ring.
- 12. Barn curfew will be 11:00 pm.
- Unsportmanship behavior will not be tolerated. Exhibitor showing unsportmanship behavior will be removed from the show

BREEDING SHEEP

- 1. All recognized breeds will be judged. Exhibitor must designate the breed at time of entry, no papers required.
- 2. All breeding sheep must be trimmed and in show condition.
- 3. Mutton breeds must be washed.
- 4. Breeding sheep for the Open classes will be on Wednesday Aug 9th @ 4 pm

MARKET LAMBS

- Only lambs exhibited and owned by county 4-H and FFA members are eligible for the Junior Market Lamb Show and Junior Livestock Auction.
- 2. Weight limits will be 110-145 pounds. Market lambs under 110 lbs. will be sifted, but can be shown in the feeder lamb and showmanship classes.
- 3. Lambs cannot be shown in both market and breeding classes.
- 4. Each exhibitor will be allowed to enter and show up to three animals in the junior market shows, but only two of any one species. Exhibitors will only be allowed to sell one market animal in the Junior Livestock Auction.
- 5. Only Blue and Red ribbon lambs will be allowed to sell in the auction.
- 6. Lambs will be shown slick shorn. They must have been completely tight shorn within two weeks of the show and prior to weigh-in with no more than one-quarter inch wool.
- 7. Exhibitors are required to dress neatly at both the show and sale. FFA exhibitors must wear an FFA jacket or white shirt with an official FFA tie. 4-H exhibitors must wear a white shirt that buttons down the front with a fold over collar with a 4-H emblem attached.
- 8. Exhibitors must check out with Supervisor between 12:00 pm and 2:00 pm for all species.
- 8. All market ewe lambs must have a scrapies tag in their ear before coming to the fair or be sifted.

FITTING AND SHOWMANSHIP

- 1. All junior market lamb exhibitors must participate. Exhibitor must show their own project animal unless cleared by department supervisor.
- 2. The animal and exhibitors will be judged.
- 3. Buckles will be given to 1st and 2nd place in each division. 3rd thru 5th will recieve awards.
- 4. Individual appearance of exhibitor is important.
- 5. The purpose of this event is to help exhibitors develop skills in fitting and showing animals.
- Exhibitors will be divided by grade as of October 1, of the previous year.

Seniors: 9th - 12th grade Intermediates: 6th - 8th grade Juniors: 3rd - 5th grade

Lambs not meeting minimum weight requirements are still eligible to be entered in the Fitting and Showmanship Contest.

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

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

LIVESTOCK- AUCTION

JUAB COUNTY FAIR JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION Friday August 9th, 5:30 pm


- 1. Entries open only to resident FFA and 4-H members of Juab County. Participants must be residents of Juab County at the time of the first weigh-in and tagging date. To be eligible for the auction, exhibitor must be enrolled at the Extension office before the individual species tagging date.
- 2. Exhibitors must be in the third grade but not less than 8 years of age as of October 1, of the previous year. Exhibitors can only show through the same season as their high school graduation but not past their 19th birthday.
- 3. All market livestock exhibitors must show and sell their own animals unless excused for reasons deemed acceptable by the department supervisor.
- 4. Exhibitors are required to dress neatly at both the show and sale. FFA exhibitors must wear an FFA jacket or white shirt with an official FFA tie. 4-H exhibitors must wear a white shirt that buttons down the front, with a fold over collar with a 4-H emblem attached. Exhibitors not adhering to this rule will not be allowed to show or sell their animal.
- 5. All 4-H and FFA market steer, lamb, goat and hog exhibitors will be required to turn in an updated record book, prior to receiving their sale check. These books need to follow the guidelines set by the 4-H office or the FFA department.
- 6. Any member who has not completed the 4-H portfolio or FFA record book, and picked up their check by November 30th of that year, will have the booster money donated to the auction account and will only receive the money for the actual market value of the animal.
- 7. Each exhibitor will only be allowed to sell one animal through the Junior Livestock Auction. Members exhibiting more than one market animal at the fair will need to complete and sign the master declaration form no later than 1 hour after the selection of the Grand Champion Beef. If this master form is not signed, the exhibitor's highest placing animal will be sold in the auction.
- 8. In the event that an exhibitor receives more than one Champion or Reserve, they must decide which champion to sell in the auction and which one to take home.
- 9. All market animals must have been weighed, tagged, & ownership declared at first weigh in. The exhibitor will own, feed and care for their animals for not less than 100 consecutive days for beef, 90 consecutive days for hogs and 60 consecutive days for lambs/goats immediately prior to the fair. Animals must be fed and kept in Juab County from the weigh in date until the fair. Any market animal leaving the county for more than three consecutive days during the ownership period must have it cleared through the department supervisor or Extension Office.
- 10. All market animals will only be weighed once. Animals not making weight will be sifted.
- 11. A shrink on lambs, goats,pigs, or beef may be assessed by management where there is indication that the animals have been over filled.
- 12. Carcass Beef contest rules are available at the USU Extension Office.
- 13. Weight limit for Beef will be 1125 lbs. to 1400 lbs. Weight limit for lambs will be 110-145 lbs. Lambs weighing over 145 will be sold at 145 lbs. Weight limit for hogs will be 230-290.

 Hogs weighing over 290 will be sold at 290 lbs. Goats must have a minum weight of 45 lbs or will be sifted. Only blue and red ribbon market Beef, lambs, and hogs, goats are eligible for the sale.
- 14. Exhibitors will be required to care for their animals until they are released Saturday or they will forfeit their premium money.
- 15. The sales committee, auctioneer, and staff of the fair accept no liability for injury or death of sale animals. Animals are the responsibility of the exhibitor until packer or individual accepts delivery. Packers or individual sale buyers have the right to refuse a sick or injured animal at time of loading and ownership of the animal reverts to the exhibitor.
- 16. All market Beef must be under 30 months of age to be eligible for the Junior Livestock Auction and Carcass Contest.
- 17. It is suggested that all market hogs entering the show be sent directly to the processing plant at the end of the fair.
- 18. Any exhibitor showing abusive behavior towards their animal will result in disqualification and will be asked to leave the show ring.
- 19. Barn curfew will be at 11:00 pm.
- 20. Unsportmanship behavior will not be tolerated. Exhibitor showing unsportmanship behavior will be removed from the show.













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
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
